CML is a former Centre of Excellence from 2012-2022 funded by the Danish National Research Foundation.

The CML works to establish theoretical models for the study of medieval literature in a European scale, set within wider Afro-Eurasian contexts, from c. 500 CE to c. 1500 CE.
